# I. Meeting Called to Order:

With a quorum present, Chairman Brett Barner called the meeting of the Lake Jessamine Water Advisory Board (Advisory Board) to order at 5:08 p.m.

# II. Approval of the May 4, 2017 Meeting Minutes:

Upon a Motion by David Geller, seconded by Judy Martin, and carried with all present members voting AYE by voice vote; the Advisory Board approved the May 4, 2017 meeting minutes as presented.

# III. Public Comment on Propositions Before the Advisory Board:

Debbie Goodwin spoke briefly about the Advisory Board inviting representatives from the Water Sports Industry Association to attend an upcoming Advisory Board meeting. The Advisory Board agreed to add the item to the August 2017Agenda. Marson Nance stated he would contact the Association.

# IV. Environmental Protection Division (EPD) Report:

#### **GreenPLACE** Presentation

Beth Jackson, Environmental Program Supervisor of the County's Green PLACE program, gave a presentation on Orange County's Green PLACE program and offered insight into how the program's lands properties are managed.

#### **Undeveloped Parcels Discussion**

The Advisory Board discussed the proposal to purchase the three undeveloped parcels south of Cypress Grove Park for donation to, and inclusion in the Orange County Green

PLACE program. Beth Jackson was on hand to answer questions about how the properties may be integrated into the program.

Upon a Motion by Carolyn Accola, seconded by Cynthia McCurry and carried by a simple majority voting AYE by voice vote, with Judy Martin voting NAY, David Geller abstaining, and Brett Barner casting the final vote in favor of the motion; the Lake Jessamine Water Advisory Board approved the expenditure of up to \$115,000.00 for the purchase of the three undeveloped parcels south of Cypress Grove Park and associated costs.

# Orange County Sheriff's Office Lake Patrol Services

Marson Nance distributed copies of the Orange County Sheriff's Office Lake Patrol report for June 2017.

#### June 2017:

- Lake patrolled during 14 shifts on 12 days.
- No vessel accidents.
- 12 warnings issued; 1 citation issued to non lake resident.
- 10 boat inspections conducted.

# Spring Planting Recap

Marson Nance reported that on June 12, 2017 approximately 2,100 plants were installed over 34 individual properties on Lakes Tyner and Jessamine. Mr. Nance spoke with many residents, both those who participated and those who did not, and received many positive comments. Mr. Nance recommended that for future planting projects, if the number of individual participating properties is greater than 20, the project be split into two days.

# **Incentive Programs Update**

Marson Nance reported he is working with other lake managers to create a Backyard BMP program which MSTU/MSBU Advisory Boards can use to help fund small residential water quality projects. Mr. Nance reported that he has worked on an application and attempted to put it in agreement with other Orange County grant and reimbursement programs. Mr. Nance discussed how this would change the Lake Jessamine MSTU incentive program, primarily in that only property owners would be able to apply for funds (not renters), and labor for which funds are requested must be performed by approved Orange County contractors.
