I. Meeting Called to Order:

With a quorum present, Vice Chair Caroline St. Clair called the meeting of the Lake Holden Advisory Board (Advisory Board) to order at 5:39 p.m.

II. Approval of the July 19, 2017 Meeting Minutes:

Upon a Motion by Mike Powell, seconded by Dana Kruetzfeldt, and carried with all present members voting AYE by voice vote, with Lionel Robbins being absent; the meeting minutes for July 19, 2017 were approved as submitted.

III. Public Comment:

Vice Chair St. Clair opened the floor for public comment. Resident Gregg Kiffer addressed the Advisory Board with concerns about algae, aquatic weeds, and the increasing amount of accumulated vegetation on his shoreline. Discussion ensued about ways to properly maintain shorelines and access corridors. Hearing no further requests, the public comment period was closed.

IV. Environmental Protection Division (EPD) Report:

Aquatic Plant Management

Melissa Lavigne reported that on Tuesday August 8, 2017, EPD and the Florida Fish & Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) surveyed the lake for pondweed. FWC agreed to amend the permit to treat designated trails to maintain public access between the lobes of the lake. The permit was increased from 10.5 acres to a total of 13 acres of public navigation tracks. Treatment is scheduled for August 2017. Homeowners may apply for FWC permits to treat pondweed in their access corridors and to reach open water. Discussion ensued about stocking triploid grass carp for biological control of aquatic plants.

Annual Costs for Routine Services in County Fiscal Year 2017/2018

Melissa Lavigne distributed the requested budget reports and stated the 2017/2018 fiscal year will start on October 1, 2017. The Advisory Board reviewed and approved the cost for regular annual maintenance of water quality best management practices (BMP) to include street sweeping services (\$20K) and curb inlet basket cleaning services (\$20K).

Upon a Motion by Rick Richbourg, seconded by Mike Powell, and carried with all present members voting AYE by voice vote, with Lionel Robbins being absent; the Advisory Board approved an expenditure not to exceed \$40,000 for routine maintenance services, i.e., street sweeping and stormwater filter basket cleaning, for the 2017/2018 fiscal year.

Sunken Vessel

Melissa Lavigne reported that Florida registration numbers were located on the sunken vessel located offshore from 3789 Laguna Street. FWC law enforcement was notified and will address the issue.

Westmoreland Pond Improvement Project

Melissa Lavigne relayed that EPD and Public Works met with the Commissioner's Office to discuss the Westmoreland Pond Retrofit Project. There was discussion about the potential for increased maintenance costs resulting from the proposed water quality retrofit project. The Public Works Department may consider cost-sharing with the Lake Holden MSTU on maintenance responsibilities if the project moves forward. The Lake Holden MSTU would be responsible for any maintenance outside of mowing, e.g., spraying the pond for hydrilla. The project has not been approved at this time; the Advisory Board took the information under advisement.

Real Time Monitoring

Melissa Lavigne distributed sample data reports and pictures of Lake Jessamine's realtime monitoring station. Discussion ensued.
