With lack of a quorum, the attending members and staff held a discussion about the state funding arts advocacy tools and the four one-sheets that we had talked about at the last meeting. Trudy Wild volunteered to work on creating them. For the fourth item, comparing state's DCA ranked recommendations against the legislators' special projects, a brainstorming idea was to have two columns, "Vetted" and "Non-Vetted," showing the amount of requests and the amount funded. In the middle would be characteristics with a "check" on the "vetted" side showing that characteristic as being true with the DCA's process and an "x" on the other side showing it is not true of the non-vetted requests from legislators' projects. The items to instill confidence in the DCA process are:

- ✓ Matching funds
- ✓ Citizen (or Independent) Review
- √ Four-year Financial Review
- √ Fair Competitive Process
- √ Conservative Request Caps
- ✓ Compliance Control

Members also reaffirmed the Government in the Sunshine requirements and discussed that it might be better to ask Jan Clanton (new member of the TDT ARC board) to join this Advocacy Committee rather than Joshua Vickery. That way Vickery could continue to work on the "Arts Means Business" project with Vicki Landon outside of the posted meetings' requirement.

The idea of a cultural master plan was again discussed as a platform for approaching the direction, resources and components of our cultural community heading into the future.
