This addendum is hereby incorporated into the solicitation documents of the project referenced above. The following items are clarifications, corrections, additions, deletions and/or revisions to and shall take precedence over the original documents. <u>Underlining</u> indicates additions, deletions are indicated by <u>strikethrough</u>.

- A. The following are questions/responses/clarifications:
  - 1. Can a certified WBE with Orange County submit as prime and also fulfill the 27% WBE requirement?

Response: No, a certified WBE with Orange County <u>cannot</u> submit as a prime and also fulfill the 27% M/WBE requirement. An Orange County certified M/WBE submitting a proposal as a Prime must propose to allocate sub-consultant utilization to other Orange County certified M/WBEs, in the applicable scope area, in order to fulfill the 27% M/WBE requirement. Also, the RFP states the proposers must submit signed Letter of Intent (Form M-1) with their proposal for all current Orange County certified M/WBE subconsultants identified on Form B. Refer to paragraph 8e on page 5.

2. Section 22, Key Personnel, states that both the Project Manager and the Project Engineer must be registered PEs in the state of Florida. Would the County consider relaxing this requirement to allow either one or the other of these Key Personnel to be PEs, but not both?

Response: Requirements specified under section 22, Key Personnel remain unchanged.

B. The Proposer shall acknowledge receipt of this addendum by completing the applicable section in the solicitation or by completion of the acknowledgement information on the addendum. Either form of acknowledgement must be completed and returned not later than the date and time for receipt of the proposal.
