EASTERN REGIONAL WATER SUPPLY FACILITY - SODIUM HYPOCHLORITE SYSTEM CONVERSION TO BULK

This addendum is hereby incorporated into the bid documents of the project referenced above. The following items are clarifications, corrections, additions, deletions and/or revisions to and shall take precedence over the original documents. <u>Underlining</u> indicates additions, deletions are indicated by strikethrough.

A. CLARIFICATIONS

- 1. Q: Attachment E References states Element #3 "Installation of chemical pumping of a minimum of 25 gallons per minute". Please clarify that the Owner did not mean 25 gallons per hour. This would be more in line to Specifications #11245 of 38.5 to 200 gph for this project.
 - A: Element 3 should read Installation of chemical pumping of a minimum of 25 gallons per hour. See revisions to Item 28. References, Element 3 of the Instructions to Bidders in Section C below.
- 2. Q: Please consider a reduction from three (3) similar projects successfully completed within the last ten (10 years) to one (1) completed within the last ten (10) years.
 - A: The number of similar project references will remain at three (3).
- 3. Q: Item 28. References of the Instructions to Bidders, specifically Element 2, requires that the bidder shall have installation of sodium hypo storage tanks with minimum capacity of 10,000 gallons. Our company meets the other criteria required relating to sodium hypochlorite systems, and have done dozens of such projects over the years, but we do not have a project of 10,000 gallon FRP tanks that contained sodium hypochlorite. We have up to 5,000 gallons. We have installed 10,000 gallon FRP tanks that contained other chemicals, just not sodium hypo. Would the owner/engineer please consider eliminating the requirement of the FRP tanks needing to have contained solely sodium hypochlorite? If the contractor can clearly meet Element 1, then Element 2 should be based on the ability to provide and install a size of 10,000 gallon FRP tanks and not based on the type of chemical it contains.
 - A: Element 2 shall be changed to 10,000-gallon horizontal and vertical fiberglass tanks (FRP), without a requirement for the chemical. See revisions to Item 28. References, Element 2 of the Instructions to Bidders in Section B below.
- 4. Q: Item 28. References of the Instructions to Bidders, specifically Element 3, requires a minimum of 25 gallons per minute of pumping equipment. I believe the intention of the requirement is 25 gallon per hour. Please confirm.
 - A: Confirmed. Element 3 should read Installation of chemical pumping of a minimum of 25 gallons per hour.

B. ATTACHMENT E, REFERENCES, Element 2:

Installation of horizontal and vertical fiberglass (FRP) sodium hypochlorite storage tanks with minimum capacity of 10,000 gallons.

C. ATTACHMENT E, REFERENCES, Element 3:

Installation of chemical pumping of a minimum of 25 gallons per minute-hour.

D. IFB Y20-719-TA BID SCHEDULE

IFB Y20-719-TA BID SCHEDULE IS DELETED AND REPLACED WITH Y20-719-TA REVISED BID SCHEDULE ATTACHED AND LABELED THIS ADDENDUM.
