Community Vision & Discussion

Members were asked to paint a vision statement for this section

- Byron: Would like to see the movement in less pollution, EVs, hydrogen, experimental and model for our region.
- Susan Glickman Electrification must have equity as front and center, GHG, electrification to specifically
 address pollutants, and public health. We should prioritize AV / CV and most traveled routes, digital divide,
 life-cycle acknowledgement and thinking of these assets, used electric vehicles.
- Madeline I would like to see a mass transit system that is reliable, where everybody rides together, equity, point to point connections. multiple reliable ways. visitor efficiency.
- Dr. Aty Everything we do in the U.S. currently revolving around the vehicle, planning and land use. We will need a shift in our urbanization and prioritize higher density otherwise it is difficult for transit services to succeed.
- John Slot Resident should have mobility options to live work and play their best lives. Without friction and
 without barrier. We need to plan regional connected solutions to make the system of the future. There is a
 great amount of power in a mobile app that can engineer the best route and modes. Behavioral change and
 PSA is going to be a critical part of the transition that will be elongated and long term.

• Renzo - how do we get to tomorrow? We need to play the long game. Identify and establish the milestones. How do we transition? By key behavioral shifts and incremental shifts, technology and mobility will push us there to some degree. We need to focus to address safety now as first priority.
